NEWPORT, RHODE ISLAND WAS SETTLED BY THE ENGLISH IN 1639. MANY RELIGIONS SETTLED IN NEWPORT, PROTESTANTS, JEWISH AND QUAKERS. JEWISH PEOPLE CAME IN 1650, BUT THEIR REAL CONTRIBUTION TO CULTURAL AND ECONOMICS LIFE CAME ABOUT 1750.

THE QUAKERS ALSO CAME ABOUT 1650. THEY BECAME THE MOST INFLUENTIAL OF NEWPORT'S POLITICAL, SOCIAL, AND ECONOMIC LIFE OF THE TOWN INTO THE 18th CENTURY. THEIR PLAIN STYLE REFLECTED THE EARLY LANDSCAPE. THEY WERE HIGHLY SKILLED CRAFTSMEN, MAKING BEAUTIFUL FURNITURE.

NEWPORTS HISTORY IS REMARKABLE IN MANY WAYS. AND EVEN TODAY, NEWPORTS STRONG DIVERSITY KEEPS THE CITY ALIVE AND VIBRANT.

WITH A RICH TAPESTRY OF NAVAL HISTORY, THE CITY FRAMED BY NARRAGANESTT BAY, NESTLED DEEP IN THE NEW ENGLAND COAST LINE, NEWPORT WAS A JEWEL IN THE CROWN OF THE UNITED STATES NAVY.

IF YOU WILL LET YOUR MIND WANDER ONCE AGAIN TO THOSE TIMES ABOARD THE USS BRISTOL DD857, TRY TO REMEMBER SOME OF THE BEST TIMES OF YOUR NAVY DAYS.

THE MIND PLAYS TRICKS ON US FROM TIME TO TIME, BUT TRY TO REMEMBER PLACES AND EVENTS THAT MAY HAVE FORMED A LIFE OF ITS OWN WHILE YOU WERE SERVING YOUR COUNTRY.

NEWPORT.—, VARIETY WOULD BEST DESCRIBE THIS CITY. TO DESCRIBE NEWPORT, THE ONLY WORD THAT I CAN THINK OF IS MEMORIES.. FOR INSTANCE, WHEN "WILLIE" CAME BACK TO THE SHIP FROM LIBERTY IN NEWPORT, HE WAS ALL DRESSED IN HIS BEST UNIFORM OF DRESS BLUES. HE HAD HIS UNIFORM PRESSED, SHOES SHINED, LOOKING LIKE THE PERFECT SAILOR, THEN WHILE WEARING THAT HEAVY PEA COAT, HE SLIPPED ON ICE AND FELL IN THE DRINK. THE ONLY THING AFLOAT WAS HIS FLAT HAT. HAD HE BEEN TO THE BLUE MOON?

MEMORIES OF THE BLUE MOON VARY ACCORDING TO WHICH SHIPMATE IS REMEMBERING. THE BLUE MOON GOES FROM A CLUB WITH A BAR, BAND, SINGER, AND A DANCE FLOOR TO A STRIP JOINT. DID THE BLUE MOON CHANGE? OR MAYBE OUR MEMORIES HAVE BEEN ALTERED.

SOME OF THE SHIPMATES REMEMBER THE BLUE MOON AS A BAR THAT HAD THE SHIPMATES AS ITS MOST FREQUENT PATRONS. IT WAS A BAR THAT CERTAIN FELLOWS REMEMBER WELL AS A PLACE THEY WOULD NOT HAVE INVITED THEIR BEST GIRL, MOTHER OR SISTER. IT HAD A TYPE

OF ENTERTAINMENT THAT ONLY THE SHIPMATES COULD ENJOY TO THE FULLEST. I CAN NOT DESCRIBE THE BLUE MOON AS IT REALLY WAS, I WILL LEAVE THAT TO THE MEMORY OF THE SHIPMATES. NO MATTER. WHAT THE BLUE MOON WAS OR WHAT IT HAD FOR THE FLOOR SHOW, IT WAS INDEED A VERY POPULAR PLACE. IT WILL REMAIN A MEMORY. MAYBE IT IS JUST AS WELL TO REMAIN AN UNSPOKEN ONE.

AND WHAT ABOUT THE SNAKE PIT. MEMORIES SAY THAT WAS NOT THE BEST PLACE TO BE. A LOT OF FIGHTS AND PROBABLY A GOOD PLACE TO STAY AWAY FROM, EVEN ON A GOOD DAY.

A SAILOR COULD GET A GOOD MEAL AT THE HOFFBRAU HAUS AND HOTEL. IT SAT HIGH ON A HILL ABOVE THE CITY. ONE SAILOR REMEMBERS GETTING SOME PORK CUTLETS IN NEWPORT THAT WERE SAVORY AND ENJOYABLE..

NEWPORT WAS NOTHING MORE OR LESS THAN A NAVY TOWN. A NAVY TOWN CARRIES WITH IT CERTAIN RESPONSIBILITIES. NEWPORT NEEDED TO BE OPEN TO THE SHIPMATES FOR FOOD AND DRINK AND ENTERTAINMENT. NEWPORT HAD ALL THE COMPONETS THAT WAS NEEDED TO FILL THE BILL TO QUALIFY AS A NAVY TOWN. IT BECAME HOME TO THE BRISTOL FOR A LONG TIME AND THE SHIPMATES REMEMBER IT WITH GREAT FONDNESS.

THE MEMORIES OF THE SHIPMATES SEEM TO LINGER IN THE SHADOWS OF THEIR MINDS, MEN LIKE HOAGIE, WILLIE, JERRY AND DON TO NAME A FEW. EACH STREET, AND THE ATLANTIC FLEET DOCK, ALL THE NIGHTCLUBS, BARS, DINERS AND EVERYTHING ELSE IN NEWPORT HOLD MEMORIES FOR THE MEN THAT SERVED THEIR COUNTRY. THEY SERVED, PROTECTED AND DEFENDED THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA WITH HONOR AND PRIDE.

THE MEMORIES OF THESE SHIPMATES HAVE ARE WONDERFULLY SECRETIVE THOUGHTS THAT BELONG ONLY TO THE MEN THEMSELVES. ONCE IN A BLUE MOON PUN INTENDED, A SHIPMATE WILL LET YOU INTO THAT SPECIAL HIDING PLACE, SOMEWHERE IN THEIR MIND, AND TELL YOU A STORY ABOUT THEIR TIME ABOARD THE BRISTOL. IT IS A RARE OCCASION WHEN THEY WILL GO BEYOND THAT CERTAIN POINT AND REVEAL A MEMORY KNOWN ONLY TO THEM.
