




### FORT FISHER

STATE HISTORIC SITE

LARGEST EARTHEN COASTAL FORTIFICATION IN THE
CONFEDERACY, ORIGINAL CONSTRUCTION COMMENCED
MAY, 1861 AND CONTINUED UNTIL DECEMBER, 1864
WHEN THE FORT CAME UNDER FEDERAL ASSAULT
FORT FISHER KEPT WILMINGTON OPEN TO BLOCKADE
RUNNERS, PROVIDING A LIFE LINE OF CRITICAL SUPPLIES
FOR THE CONFEDERATE ARMIES, THE TWO LARGEST
LAND—SEA BATTLES IN HISTORY UNTIL THAT TIME
TOOK PLACE HERE DEC 24—25 AND JAN. 13—15, 1865
RESULTING IN THE FALL OF THE FORT.
